So what happens is that the perfectionist in us constantly strives for the *something* that is not even real. That's right, there is NO perfect destination ... period. There is, however, the journey; and the closest we can ever get to perfection is to live in the moment, and live for others. Accept the fact that you will not have perfection because we are all human. This allows us the FREEDOM to make mistakes. Isn't that GREAT!! You now have my unofficial OK to make them! But don't

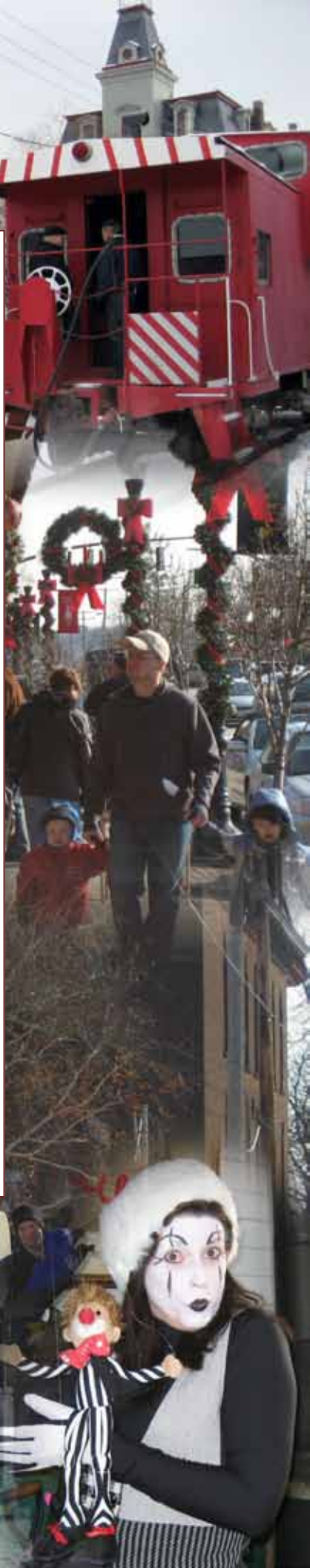

Cleveland Clinic Limits Visitation to Adults 19 And Over to Prevent Flu

To help prevent the spread of the seasonal flu and H1N1, Cleveland Clinic is limiting visitation to adults only and is asking visitors to refrain from bringing children under the age of 19 to visit patients at any of its hospitals. The increase of H1N1 in schools, limited supply of H1N1 vaccinations available and people carrying H1N1 before symptoms actually appear were the strong incentives which led to this decision. In addition, visitors 19 and older should only come to the hospital if they are healthy. Although this may be inconvenient, we believe this will help prevent the spread of flu to our patients, visitors and employees in this unique flu season. Visiting limitations include all areas of Cleveland Clinic’s main campus including Children’s Hospital; Children’s Hospital Shaker Campus; Euclid, Fairview, Hillcrest, Huron, Lakewood, Lutheran, Marymount, Medina and South Pointe hospitals; and Ashtabula County Medical Center.

Bug Off, Flu!

Looking for a way to help stop the flu? Stay a step ahead. Here are some tips from Kaiser Permanente on simple and effective ways to help avoid colds, seasonal flu, and H1N1 flu.

Get a flu shot. The best protection you and your loved ones have against the flu is to get a flu shot in the fall.

- **Keep 'em clean.** Hand washing is the most important thing you can do to keep from getting and spreading colds and the flu. Using just plain soap and warm water is as effective as using antibacterial products. Carry an alcohol-based hand gel (such as Purell) to use when you can't wash.
- **Cover your cough.** Cold and flu viruses are spread by airborne particles. Cough or sneeze into a tissue or your upper sleeve instead of your hands, so that you don't make others sick. If you do use your hands, wash them as soon as you can.
- **Avoid touching your face.** Cold and flu viruses are often spread by touching something or someone that is contaminated with germs and then rubbing your eyes or nose, or touching your mouth.
- **Clean surfaces** (such as counter tops, telephones, toys, cups, bathroom sinks) that sick children or adults may have contaminated. Find out how to keep a cold- and flu-free kitchen.
- **Stay healthy.** Keep up your resistance to infection by eating well (including antioxidant-rich fruits and vegetables), getting plenty of rest, managing stress, and exercising regularly.
- **Be a savvy senior.** If you're 65 or older, or have a chronic health condition or weakened immune system, be sure you've had your pneumococcal vaccination.
- **Try not to pass it on.** If you get sick,

A little Bedford trivia...

History of Willis Street

Willis Street is one of the oldest streets in Bedford. Named after the Willis family, Fanny Willis was an early landowner.

The beginning of the railroad through Bedford changed Willis Street forever.

The first railroad tracks ran along the east side; the right-of-way is still visible between Public Square and the stone viaduct. This track was abandoned in 1902 when a two-track line was laid a few yards west of Willis.

The original Train Depot was built in 1852 and stood at the southwest corner of the Commons. It was torn down three years ago. Abe Lincoln spoke from this Depot during his second inaugural trip.

In the early 20th century, Italian immigrants settled along Willis and the short streets near the track. The area is known as Little Italy.

The famous Bedford Glens Dance Hall, which burned in 1943, was a few yards west of Willis on the Glens Road.

2010-11 Ohio Workers' Comp Rate Changes Decrease Group Savings and Impact Small Employers

On Friday, Oct. 30, 2009, the Bureau of Workers' Compensation (BWC) Board of Directors voted to reduce the maximum discount for group-rated employers to 65 percent. However, with the break-even factors charged to each tier, group maximum savings will be 51 percent. The board decreased the maximum discount by reducing the maximum credibility and applying a break-even factor. The new rates will be effective July 1, 2010. Employers will see the new rates when they pay their premium for the July 1, 2010, to Dec. 31, 2010 pay period, which is due by the end of February 2011.

The BWC has also lowered the minimum requirements for experience rating starting July 1, 2010. This may mean smaller employers who were kept at base rates due to size, but have some claim activity over the past 5 years, could become experience rated with an increase in premiums. Smaller employers with little to no claim activity could also see a credit on their premium.
